Mynydd Y Gaer, Bridgend

Duration: 1 day - 2015

Volunteer hours to date: 26

Brief:

To reinstate the definitive route, ensure clear signage and reduce habitat damage.

After various meetings, this was the first approved Treadlightly project in Bridgend. GLASS Area Reps carried out surveys in advance to ensure legality and route status, then agreed partnership working in conjunction with the Coity Wallia Commons Biodiversity Officer, the commoners, and landowner.

GLASS & Treadlightly volunteers agreed to carry out waymarking along the legal definitive line to ensure all intersections were clearly identified to all users. The current line being driven had fallen some way off causing concern, and potential disruption to wildlife and habitat. With Highways approval the correct route was reinstated and gates moved/realigned by the landowner to avoid confusion to vehicular users.

This was done using a small team of volunteers, with new style recycled plastic posts supplied by Bridgend CC complimented with Treadlightly signage.
